



Flea Treatment Preparation Sheet

Fleas are very difficult to eradicate without the help of the client. With our years of experience and training in Pest Control & Wildlife Removal we have developed a checklist for our clients to complete before and after the treatment process. When this checklist is followed our flea treatments work faster and are more effective while cutting the cost of time and money spent eradicating the issue. We ask that you please review this worksheet and complete it in the order indicated before your treatment. Please keep in mind that our success will be a team effort. This means that you will need to help us help you by completing this checklist.

Check List

- 1. Clear all carpeted floors including closets of boxes, clothing and any other items that will prevent treatment.
- 2. Wash (in hot water) or destroy all pet bedding. If bedding is put into trash, put into plastic bag and dispose of into an exterior trash bag.
- 3. Mop wood, tile, and vinyl floors.
- 4. Vacuum all carpeting and rugs thoroughly.
- 5. Vacuum pet sleeping and resting areas under furniture, cracks and crevices in floors and draperies. Windowsills and appliance tops need to be cleaned if you have cats that rest on them.
- 6. Vacuum furniture especially between and under cushions. Empty the contents of the vacuum cleaner into a plastic bag. Immediately dispose of the bag in an outside container.
- 7. Remove pets from the home (prior to application). Store or cover all pet food containers and bowls. Cover fishbowls or fish tanks.
- 8. Arrange to have dogs, cats and other flea-infested pets professionally treated by your local veterinary clinic at the same time the home is treated.
- 9. We will be going through your entire home.

Be prepared to vacate the dwelling during service and for about 3-4 hours following service to allow time for Chemicals to dry.

After Our Treatment Is Complete

- 1. Clean the carpet or floors with detergents or cleaners for at least two weeks after treatment is complete (doing this will remove our chemical residual).
- 2. Continue to vacuum daily for two weeks. Be sure to dispose of the bag after each vacuuming (in an exterior trash bin).
- 3. Bag, launder and dry your garments (hot cycle) as directed by your Service Technician.

Expect that if you have a sever infestation that we may need to return for a follow-up visit. In most cases can eradicate your property in one visit; however, you should be prepared for the worst.
